September 2020 Stats

Sheriff Kevin M. Henderson reports the following statistics for the month of September 2020, from the divisions of the Ontario County Office of Sheriff:

The 9-1-1 Center processed a total of 13,260 events, including 4296 events for the sheriff's office, 1121 calls for emergency medical services, 317 calls for fire departments, 1359 events for the Canandaigua PD and 11108 events for the Geneva PD. Of these calls, 23 calls were requests for medical assistance for reported overdose calls. Sheriff Deputies used Narcan on 7 occasions to revive an overdose victim.

A total of 326 car crashes were responded to during the month, including, 51 crashes with injury, 102 property damage only crashes, 61 car-deer collisions, 2 vehicles in ditches, 4 rollover crashes, and 33 hit & run crashes. The OCSO K-9 unit reported 14 calls for service during the month to include drug searches, tracks, public presentations and assists to other agencies. Deputies assigned to Eastview Mall responded to a total of 93 calls for service at the mall. 12 arrests for larceny, 2 disturbance, 3 animal complaints for dogs being left in motor vehicles, 6 motor vehicle accidents, 8 suspicious persons, 2 assist ambulance as well as other calls.

The civil division attempted service on 186 papers and served a total of 54 papers, including 34 family court papers and 18 subpoenas. There were 2 evictions during the month. The office received 56 warrants during the month, and closed out 39 warrants.

Sheriff Deputies did continue to process pistol permit applications, and Sheriff Henderson reports that 336 pistol permit investigations have been completed so far in 2020. The County Clerk is now again accepting applications, and the Office of Sheriff has received 79 new pistol permit applications for the month of September.

Special traffic patrols were worked in the townships of Canandaigua, Farmington, Geneva, Victor and South Bristol during the month. Deputies issued 44 tickets in Canandaigua, 49 tickets in Farmington, 14 tickets in Geneva, 60 tickets in Victor and 22 South Bristol.

A total of 115 people were committed to the county jail, including 83 males and 32 females. A total of 44 people were held for Pre-arraignments at the jail.

The Special Investigation Unit (SIU) reported 5 drug related arrests during the month. They did include arrests for Criminal Possession of Controlled Substance 3<sup>rd</sup>, class B felony, and Criminal Sale of Controlled Substance 3<sup>rd</sup>, also a class B felony. There were 0 overdose deaths in September, and the investigations are ongoing to arrest those responsible for the sale which caused these deaths. Sheriff Henderson is committed to seeking those who sell drugs in the County be arrested.

## Sex Offender Registry Program:

Sex offender registry activity related events, 291 address verifications, 16 address changes, 2 photo updates. Anyone can check the Office of Sheriff's website at [ontariosheriff.org](http://ontariosheriff.org) to see if a sex offender is registered in Ontario County. **Sheriff's Office received funding from the US Marshals Service Sex Offender Address Verification program and implemented a county wide detail, verifying all registered sex offenders. 5 offenders were identified for non-compliance and possible pending charges.**

## Marine Unit Activity Report:

A total of 36 calls were received for the Sheriff's Office Marine Unit for the month July, which patrols both Canandaigua and Honeoye Lakes from May to October. 1 vessel inspections, 21 property checks, 3 assist boaters, 7 vessel stops, 4 hang up 911 calls, 7 navigations hazards, 2 boater education, 1 property damage boat accidents, 1 check the welfare.

It should be noted that it the lakes in the county experienced a significant increase of boat traffic, due to the long hot summer along with COVID restrictions. The sheriff's office marine unit was present on the waterways and were ensuring those who used our lakes for recreation had a safe experience.
