CALL TO ORDER	The meeting of the Public Safety Committee was called to order at 11:00 am by Chairman Robert Green.
MINUTES	Supervisor Mark Venuti made a motion to approve the minutes of the Public Safety Committee meeting from July 7, 2021. Supervisor Greg Bendzlowicz seconded the motion. The motion carried.
CAMPBELL COMMISSION	There was no report for Campbell Commission, the next meeting will be on August 5 th .
PUBLIC DEFENDER	
<i>Resolution: Amendment to Res. No. 35-2021 – The Legal Aid Bureau of Buffalo – Ontario County Public Defender</i>	Leanne Lapp presented a resolution to amend Res. No. 35-2021 to amend the contract date in the resolution. Supervisor Greg Bendzlowicz motioned to approve the resolution, seconded by Supervisor Todd Campbell. The motion carried.
DISTRICT ATTORNEY	
<i>Resolution: Authorizing Contract with National Organization for Victim Assistance for Training Services</i>	Jennifer Lewis presented a resolution to contract with National Organization for Victim Assistance for a crisis response team training services in the amount of \$13,125. At the request of Supervisor Bendzlowicz, Ms. Lewis gave a synopsis on what the training is like and how they are going to be utilized, noting the training is geared toward service providers rather than law enforcement. They go through strategies on how to work with victims when there have been casualties and how to provide services to victims and victims families and sensitivity training on cultural and religious backgrounds.

	Supervisor Bendzlowicz motioned to approve the resolution, seconded by Supervisor Menikotz. The motion carried.

The motion carried.</p> <p>Sheriff Henderson presented two resolution to accept grants: the first in the amount of \$41,040 from the Police Traffic Services Program and the second in the amount of \$1,700 from the Traffic Safety Committee for the Child Passenger Safety Incentive.</p> <p>Supervisor Venuti motioned to approve the two resolutions to accept the grant funds as a block, seconded by Supervisor Campbell. The motion carried.</p> <p>Sheriff Henderson presented a resolution to accept Q21068 for the purchase of laundry and dishwashing supplies for the jail.</p> <p>Supervisor Bendzlowicz motioned to approve the resolution to accept the quote, seconded by Supervisor Campbell. The motion carried.</p> <p>Sheriff Henderson presented a resolution to amend a contract with FLACRA for re-entry case manager services to modify the verbiage within the contract that originally stipulated that the case worker have a valid license. They now would like to change the verbiage to state that FLACRA provide the transportation for this case worker that was recently hired.</p> <p>Supervisor Mark Venuti motioned to approve the resolution, seconded by Supervisor Daryll Marshall. The motion carried.</p> <p>Sheriff Henderson reviewed the jail population:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Current – 86 • Females – 13 • Weekend High – 86 • Sentenced – 17 • Parole violations – 15 without additional criminal charges <p>Sheriff Henderson noted from July 7th through July 27th, the Road Patrol (RP) had 777 hours of overtime.</p> <p>They have vacancies for the RP and are working with the HR director. He</p>

	<p>is concerned they have 60 eligible people left on the current list. Between issues with background and not able to complete the process, he does not think they will be able to hire the number of deputies they need off this list. They may have to have a test they are trying to schedule the state. He said the challenge is that he is looking to hire 9 deputies, the City of Canandaigua was looking to hire 5, City of Geneva, 3, Wayne County 11, Livingston County 5, and other agencies. He also said one of the challenges is they do not have much time for recruitment.</p> <p>Supervisor Bendzlowicz asked if FLEA has ever promoted through radio ads or newspapers regarding recruitment. Sheriff Henderson said they have discussed it.</p> <p>The jail had 1,889.5 hours of overtime. He explained some of the challenges giving an example of a case and how the overtime grew due to the mandates with this inmate case. Discussion took place regarding policies for hospitalized inmates.</p>

<i>Updates</i>	<p>Chris DeBolt gave the following updates:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • They have an uptick in COVID cases mostly fueled by the Delta variant. • CDC came out with guidance that all people, regardless of age vaccination status, staff, students be masked K-12. • Some of the decisions will be pushed down to the local level for guidance on the opening of schools. Discussion took place regarding cases and the variables of testing. • Substantial transmission is 50-100 positive cases in a seven-day period. • Board Retreat on September 23rd with Soil and Water • Shared Services panel for August 11th on legalization of marijuana • Board pictures on before the Board meeting on August 5th. • The traveling Board meeting will be August 26th at Gannett Hill Park.
