CALL TO ORDER	Chairman Dan Marshall called the meeting to order at 10:58 a.m.
MINUTES	A motion to approve the August 16, 2021 meeting minutes was made by Supervisor Rich Russell, seconded by Supervisor Fred Wille. The motion carried.
PUBLIC HEALTH	
Resolution: 2021 Intermunicipal Agreement with Monroe County for Medicolegal Death Investigative and Forensic Pathology Services	<p>Mary Beer presented a resolution to contract with Monroe County for medicolegal death investigative and forensic pathology services.</p> <p>Supervisor Norm Teed motioned to approve the resolution, seconded by Supervisor Rich Russell. The motion carried.</p>
Resolution: Authorization to Accept ELC School Grant; CFDA #93.323 (Contract No. 6853-01) Public Health 2021-2022	<p>Ms. Beer presented a resolution to accept ELC school grant in the amount of \$2,986,763 to contract with Health Research Inc. (HRI) to partner with local school districts for testing COVID-19.</p> <p>Supervisor Rich Russell motioned to approve the resolution, seconded by Supervisor Fred Willied. The motion carried.</p>
Performance Management:	<p>Mary Beer distributed their 2019 Public Health Annual Report. She noted this is what her staff did in terms of volume and the work they did. She noted their key accomplishment was their lead on a multi-jurisdictional (6-county) national accreditation. Ms. Beer noted they are working on their annual report for the continuing accreditation. She said they are accepting covid work for that. The whole intent of accreditation is that if you live in one area you will get the same amount of public</p>

	<p>health support in another area.</p> <p>Ms. Beer went on to report on the following: She noted they worked with the Office for the Aging to provide top save lives suicide prevention. They collaborated with CAFL to go into schools to discuss vaping. They worked with students in health classes who helped create 3 videos on education the public about emotional, physical, and mental health. They collaborated with Child and Family Resources to create a 2nd Baby Café in Ontario County in the City of Geneva. 100% of her public health staff have received the flu vaccine. They did their annual “snack and chat” with the school nurses. They administered over 1,000 vaccinations at their rabies clinics. They received the Article 6, 7-year performance award of \$21,000. They have and will continue their Narcan training for the community members, schools, colleges, and probation. They did over 500 presentations; health fairs, websites and out in the community for educational opportunities. Finally, in 2019 they had a consolidated review and had no deficiencies.</p> <p>Supervisor Norm Teed motioned to accept the 2019 Public Health Annual Report, seconded by Supervisor Fred Wille. The motion carried.</p>

<p>Resolution: Reappointment to the Ontario County Youth Board – Eleanor Brooks</p> <p>Updates</p>	<p>Marsha Foote presented a resolution to reappoint Eleanor Brooks to the Ontario County Youth Board.</p> <p>Supervisor Rich Russell motioned to approve the reappointment resolution, seconded by Supervisor Norm Teed. The motion carried.</p> <p>Ms. Foote reported 7 youth and 5 adults are currently on the Youth Board. She is using this year as an education year for the board, to be knowledgeable on every piece of the board.</p>

	<p>Irene Coveny gave an update on her work with the transportation services. They are going forward with a three-county plan, which includes Ontario, Livingston, and Monroe County on an information and reservation system or a one-click one-call system for transportation. The money should be provided through the 53 grant.</p>

<p>Resolution: Authorization to Enter into Contracts in 2022 – DSS</p> <p>Informational: Transition of PINS diversion services from Probation to DSS</p> <p>Informational: DSS fiscal Update</p>	<p>Eileen Tiberio presented a resolution to grant her authority to sign contracts for DSS in 2022.</p> <p>Supervisor Rich Russell motioned to approve the resolution, seconded by Supervisor Fred Wille. The motion carried.</p> <p>Ms. Tiberio reported on the plans for transition of PINS (Persons in need of supervision) from probation in coordination with Jeff Rougeux to child welfare in DSS due to the dramatic changes in the rules limiting the legal options for kids. She explained they hope to use the two vacancy positions in probation and create case worker positions in DSS. Holly Adams noted there will be a resolution to make the changes.</p> <p>Ms. Tiberio presented the 2nd quarter financials.</p> <p>Ms. Tiberio reported the eviction moratorium is extended until the middle of January 2022. She is working with Law New York and Legal Assistance of Western NY to do some educational pieces for the community. She said the extension of the moratorium gave more rights back to the landlord. Ms. Tiberio also explained there will be a program coming out for mortgage foreclosure avoidance and reviewed some of the</p>
