CALL TO ORDER	Chairman Dan Marshall called the meeting to order at 11:00 a.m.
MINUTES	A motion to approve the September 7 th and 16 th , 2021 meeting minutes as a block was made by Supervisor Norm Teed, seconded by Supervisor Rich Russell. The motion carried.
PUBLIC HEALTH	
<i>Resolution: Authority to Establish Charges for Flu Shots – Public Health 2021-2022</i>	Mary Beer presented a resolution to establish the charges for flu shots for 2021-2022. Supervisor Rich Russell motioned to approve the resolution, seconded by Supervisor Tammie Hicks. The motion carried.
<i>Resolution: Authorization to Accept New York State Public Health Corps Fellowship Program Grant CFDA#93.323; CFDA#93.354 (Contract#15-2000-07) Public Health 2021-2023</i>	Ms. Beer presented a resolution to accept a grant in the amount of \$1.2 million for additional staff to assist with COVID-19 activities for the term of September 1, 2021-July 31, 2023. Supervisor Fred Wille motioned to approve the resolution, seconded by Supervisor Tammie Hicks. The motion carried.
<i>Resolution: Authorization to Contract with Canandaigua City Schools for COVID Testing</i>	Ms. Beer presented a resolution to contract with the Canandaigua City Schools for COVID-19 testing. Canandaigua decided to hire their own and send the County an invoice for reimbursement.

The motion carried.</p> <p>Ms. Beer presented a resolution to contract with the Ontario County schools for COVID-19 testing. It will be contracted out to Finger Lakes Staffing services.</p> <p>Supervisor Rich Russel motioned to approve the resolution, seconded by Supervisor Norm Teed. The motion carried.</p> <p>Ms. Beer presented a resolution to amend Resolution No. 335-2021 to increase the dollar amount by \$610,965 through March of 2023.</p> <p>Supervisor Norm Teed motioned to approve the resolution, seconded by Supervisor Tammie Hicks. The motion carried.</p> <p>Mary Beer gave an update on the COVID-19 cases noting the hotspots of positive cases and the transmission in schools.</p> <p>Ms. Beer reported that the state came in and did a review of their practices on the COVID-19 vaccine; how they handled, stored, and documented it. They were told they are the first county they could not find anything to site them on.</p>

<p>Resolution: <i>Amendment to Resolution 174-2021 – Habitat for Humanity of Ontario County NY 2021-2022</i></p>	<p>Irene Coveny presented a resolution to amend a contract with Habitat for Humanity to include the installation or repair of handicap accessible ramps for older adults who cannot pay for the ramps. This includes an increase of \$40,000 from the All-American Rescue funds that OFA received.</p> <p>Supervisor Tammie Hicks motioned to approve the resolution, seconded by Supervisor Rich Russell. The motion carried.</p>
<p>DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES</p>	
<p><i>Updates</i></p>	<p>Eileen Tiberio gave the following updates:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • They continue to get bits and pieces of money coming through; the newest being a home energy assistance (HEAP) added another component specifically for utility arrears. • The state has proposed comprehensive regulations on their use of hotels and motels to house homeless individuals and families. It requires the County develop an overall plan on how they will serve people that they put in hotels and motels. This includes health screening of all family members within 24 hours of placement and guarantee they can conveniently obtain balanced, nutritious, and

	<p>adequate meals as well as transportation needs. Ms. Tiberio said she has written a letter to the state asking them to withdraw these regulations in their entirety because of the lack of understanding about our population and our community resources.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • They must have a contract for specialized assessment for any of their children who are moving from foster care into congregate setting, group home, or an institution. The state gave requirements for what they consider qualified. She reported they put out an RFP and found someone who was qualified per the state regulation.
YOUTH BUREAU	
	Marsh Foote shared that she is working on a project with Family Counseling Services of the Finger Lakes, LGBTQ. Their youth are getting a bunch of their Stamp It Out t-shirts, which are white, make them into rainbow colors and distribute them; supporting the whole awareness program of Stamp IT Out.
WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT	
	There were no updates for Workforce Development.
VETERANS SERVICE AGENCY	
	Jeremy Marshall reported on the VA's Bureaus of Statistics and Data who sends an annual synopsis of the conditions of the veterans as far as what our population is, how much money they bring in and such. He said they lost 1,200 veterans last year, their population went from 8,250 to 7,060. He said a lot of that was due to death but some moving out of state. However, they were still able to bring in \$31 million dollars of benefits and cash benefits into the county, shattering their record of \$27,000.
