CALL TO ORDER

The meeting of the 209 Investigation Committee was called to order at 11:00 AM by Chairman Campbell.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Motion to approve the minutes of the September 23, 2021 meeting was made by Supervisor Singer, seconded by Supervisor Marshall, and carried.

APPROVAL OF 209 COMMITTEE RULES OF PROCEDURE

Motion to approve the Ontario County §209 Committee rules of procedure was made by Supervisor Vedora, seconded by Supervisor Ingalsbe, and carried.

UPDATE

Chairman Campbell wished to provide an update to the committee on the happenings since the last meeting. Since the last meeting the subpoenas were served, and we have had a transition in the Sheriff's office with Sheriff Henderson resigning. He thanked Chief Deputy Falbo for continuing to provide the correct, appropriate, and excellent level of public safety service to our residents in this time of transition. Please pass our thanks on to your department and thank you for stepping in and taking control at this time. Chairman Campbell then invited Chief Deputy Falbo to address the committee on what he has seen in the department and how he would like to interact with the committee going forward.

Chief Deputy Falbo appreciated the invite and opportunity to address the committee. He wanted to let the committee know that they have the departments full cooperation in this investigation. All of the department from the jail to the 9-1-1 center are trying to move forward and are providing the best public safety possible while also trying to provide a good work environment to all employees. For the subpoenas that were served to the Sheriff's department he has started to collect the information requested. He would like to offer the opportunity for the committee to come down to the

office to review the files and ask for any other files they feel are important. This may be a more efficient way of providing documents to the committee to review.

At 11:07 AM, Supervisor Vedora made the motion, seconded by Supervisor Marshall, to go into executive session regarding discussion on proposed, pending, or current litigation; motion carried.
